- April 1-3 **Ann McGinley** will present her paper, "[Ricci v. DeStefano](#): A Masculinities Analysis," at the American Men's Studies Association in Kansas City, Mo. The paper is part of a panel on Feminism and Masculinities Theory and will be moderated by a leading sociologist scholar, Michael Kimmel.
- April 1-3 **Nancy Rapoport** has been invited to speak at the American Bankruptcy Institute Annual Spring Meeting in National Harbor, MD, as part of a panel on Fulfilling the Fiduciary Duty in a Complex Commercial World. The topic is whether recent court decisions have diluted the fiduciary duty owed by directors and officers to creditors when the company is in insolvency.
- April 7-9 **Stacey Tovino** has been invited to speak about the new health care reform bill at the Annual Health Law Symposium sponsored by The Whittier Law Review in Costa Mesa, CA. Her talk is entitled, "Health Care Access, Poverty, and Health Care Reform."
