- May 1-2 **Mary LaFrance** will present a paper, "From Whether to How: The Challenge of Implementing a Full Public Performance Right in Sound Recordings," at a conference convened by Harvard University's Berkman Center for Internet and Society, the Berklee College of Music, and MIDEM. Her paper was chosen as the best public policy paper from among those submitted for the conference.
