The Nixon recapture of the Presidency and his consequent control of judicial appointments makes it clear that liberty in this country is in for a difficult four For some time now, it has seemed to some of us that the AALS has done little about these problems; because of its organizational structure, it probably cannot do much. The AALS does not represent individual law teachers; its membership is the law schools.

This may be the time for those law teachers who are interested in making legal education more responsive to the nation's problems to form an independent law teachers' association. To explore that possibility, we have agreed to get together on December 29, 1972 for lunch at 12:30 p.m. at the ACLU national offices in New York, 22 East 40th Street, eleventh floor. The ACLU has been kind enough to provide hospitality to our ad hoc group.

We might discuss such questions as the purposes of such an organization, its membership, the specific subjects of its concern, e.g., legal education, involvement in specific problem areas, an organizational structure.

Tentatively, we might think about creating an organ ization that could lobby whereever appropriate concerning legal education, civil rights and civil liberties. an organization would not duplicate the structure or functions of the AALS. Unlike the AALS, which is composed of law schools and their representatives, it would

be a membership organization of law teachers. Its functions would differ accordingly.
